WALTZ TIME



The 1st. Gent^m changes sides with his partner, giving right hand, then turns with left full round. — The 1st. Gent^m gives the right hand to the 2^d. Lady, the 1st. Lady gives the right hand to the 2^d. Gent^m. set four holding hands. the 1st. Gent^m turns his partner with left hand to her own side, down a couple. — Polka at top +

* Two bars | four bars — eight bars, + sixteen bars

The 2d Gent^m and 1st Lady turn to right and set at top and bottom, turn to right again into each others places (in the dance) set — the 1st Gent^m and 2d Lady do the same — pousett at top —

BLUE BONNETS OVER THE BORDER.

WALTZ
TIME

The 1st couple leads down the middle and up again to 2d couple's place — The Gent^m changes sides with his partner and set, advance and retire three a breast on each side — pousett at top —

KENMURE'S ON AND AWAY.

WALTZ
TIME

1st and 2^d couples right hands across, half round to left, both couples down the middle — Four hands half round to right and up again — Pousett at top —

FIGHT ABOUT THE FIRE SIDE

REEL
TIME

Down the middle — up again — the lady reels across with the 1st couple — the Gent^m with the 2^d couple — set to corners — the lady leads out the two highest Gent^m, and the Gent^m the two highest ladies, with their backs to each other —
